Winona LaDuke – Executive Director, Honor the Earth

Winona LaDuke is a rural development economist working on issues of economic, food, and energy sovereignty. She lives and works on the White Earth reservation in northern Minnesota, and leads several organizations including Honor the Earth, Anishinaabe Agriculture Institute, Akiing, and Winona's Hemp. These organizations develop and model cultural-based sustainable development strategies utilizing renewable energy and sustainable food systems. She is an international thought leader in the areas of climate justice, renewable energy, and environmental justice. She is also a leader in the work of protecting Indigenous plants and heritage foods from patenting and genetic engineering. She has authored six books including; Recovering the Sacred, All our Relations, Last Standing Woman, and her newest work The Winona LaDuke Chronicles.

Ben Benoit – Environmental Director, Leech Lake Band of Ojibwe

Born in Hartford Conn, Ben likes to jokingly tell people that he has lived the Ojibwe migration story. Starting on the East coast and ultimately making his way to Minnesota, Ben went to high school in Anoka, began college at St Cloud State and finished with a Bachelor's of Science degree from the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities in Biochemistry. After college, Ben worked for a few years in industry, as a microbiologist and chemist and when he began looking for a house but decided that city life wasn't for him and it was time to rejoin his family in the North. The best parts of Minnesota are found in this area. Some of the most pristine lakes and watersheds in the county and he is committed to protecting them for future generations to rely on as his family does today. He was taught that if we care for the manoomin, land and waters, they will care for us. That is the mission Ben works towards as Leech Lake Environmental Director and as an anishinaabe man. He hopes that through his work he can further develop relationships between local governments, help push projects that benefit all parties and share the core values that bring people together to care about the water.

Jenny Edwards – Director of Planning and Engagement, Center for Energy and Environment

Jenny Edwards is the Director of Planning and Engagement at the Center for Energy and Environment in Minneapolis. Some primary areas of work for her team include community energy planning, local government program and policy design, commercial building benchmarking policies, "non-wires" distribution planning, electric vehicle integration, and energy districts. She has been focused more and more on the growing area of advanced grid integration, which includes research and policy advising on advanced metering, beneficial electrification, and geo-targeting of energy services. Jenny's previous work in the energy field includes positions with Lawrence Berkeley National Lab, UC Berkeley, MIT, and the University of Minnesota. She is also currently an Adjunct Faculty member at the Humphrey Institute of Public Affairs.

Andrew Moratzka – Partner, Stoel Rives
